Background and Alternatives Explored:

This project is a Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) pavement preservation mill and overlay project on 5th and 6th streets between Russell St. and Higgins Ave. Both streets are Federal Urban Aid routes, therefore eligible for urban pavement preservation funding. In order for these two streets to qualify for this funding, the City was required to improve the street conditions to meet the minimum condition requirements established by MDT for preservation funding. In addition, the City brought all ADA ramps along these routes up to current ADA standards. The City Street Maintenance Division recently completed this work. The mill and overlay project will be completed during the 2020 construction season.

Financial Implications:

The City's contribution to this project was the in-kind labor and materials used to bring the streets up to the project's minimum standard needed for mill and overlay work. MDT's contribution is estimated to be around \$1.3 million. The City will continue maintenance on these streets.
