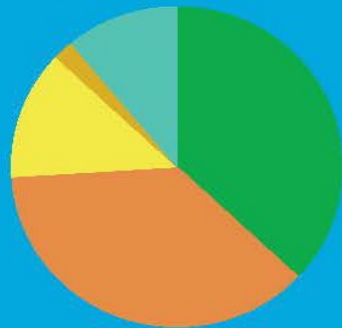

FY 2019 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Secured Funds to Close System Gaps

- 80 hours per week of call time for First Step
- YWCA Sexual Assault volunteer advocate stipends, 2 shifts per day
- 24 forensic exams for law enforcement
- Co-location of advocates with law enforcement

Collaborative Projects

- City Club panel on Missoula's response to sexual assault
- Improved safety for 208 victims of violence by implementing specialized lethality screenings by law enforcement & connection to the YWCA
- 4 educational panels for 100 violent offenders

Cross-Disciplinary Training Opportunities

- Over 200 participants attended trainings such as:
- 3rd Annual Just Response Orientation
 - 8 best practice webinars
 - 4 multidisciplinary team in-services
 - Full-day conference on creating trauma-informed courts

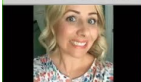
