Background:

The recent state legislation, House Bill 701 and MCA 16.13, legalized the cultivation, transport, retail, and possession of adult-use marijuana and marijuana products. The Montana State Department of Revenue will begin accepting applications from existing businesses licensed for medical marijuana to convert to adult-use marijuana business licensure on January 1, 2022. In anticipation of this date, this white paper informs proposed amendments to the City of Missoula Title 20 Zoning Ordinance. New adult-use marijuana business licenses will not be available from the state until July 1, 2023. This white paper examines the history of legalization, the impacts of marijuana related uses on the public health, welfare, and safety, and recommendations for local land use regulations to facilitate the safe implementation of the newly adopted Montana State Legislation legalizing adult use marijuana. Staff recommend that the proposed regulation revisions be applied to both medical marijuana and adult-use marijuana.
