**Background and Alternatives Explored:**

The City of Missoula, in partnership with Missoula County, is entering into a contract with Rodgers International PLLC for provision of security services across four sheltered sites: 1) Poverello Center main shelter, 2) Emergency Winter Shelter, 3) Authorized Camping Area, and 4) Temporary Safe Outdoor Space. Security services are intended to protect residents at each site, decrease calls to law enforcement, and provide additional oversight in surrounding public right of ways and public spaces. Security staff will participate in training specific to working with people who are unhoused, including: de-escalation, Mental Health First Aid, Native Community cultural considerations, Crisis Intervention Team overview, LGBTQIA+ information and resources, and more. Presence at each site will differ based on needs, as outlined in the Exhibit A Scope of Work.

**Financial Implications:**

Funding for security was approved under Mobile Care Team budget request that was approved for American Rescue Plan Act funding during the Fiscal Year 2022 budget cycle. Missoula County will also contribute funding for security through reimbursement, as approved in the County's Fiscal Year 2022 budget cycle.
