Approve an Agreement with Eric Maurer for the purchase of 1337 West Broadway.

### **Background and Alternatives Explored:**

Due to the growth of Public Works & Mobility staff with the recent realignment, a need to find additional office space became increasingly evident within the last year. The property located at 1337 West Broadway, east of the water building on Broadway, became available to satisfy space needs for the Department of Public Works & Mobility.

The City had an appraisal and inspection performed on the property before supplying earnest money to the seller. The appraisal concluded that the market value for the property is \$553,000.00.

### **Financial Implications:**

A City Treasury Loan will be taken to cover the cost of the purchasing the property. Missoula Water is currently in the process of selling some surplus properties to pay back the loan. The loan will be a term of twelve (12) months with the City's internal borrowing rate estimated to be under one percent (1%).
