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DEFINITIONS:

City Council order(ed): Formal process by which City Council adopts a resolution ordering installation, construction, or replacement of certain curbs, gutters, sidewalks, drive approaches, alley approaches and appurtenant public infrastructure improvements in certain locations.

City('s) Contractor: Contractor which City Council formally awards a construction contract through a competitive bidding process to complete construction of City Council ordered curb and sidewalk relatedright-of-way improvements project.

PURPOSE: To govern the use of Road District #1 funds to assist property owners with the cost of constructing. This Administrative Rule provides direction for implementation of the Special Improvement Assessment Program for City Council ordered curb and sidewalk and related improvements within public street right-of-ways.

APPLICABILITY: Missoula City Engineering Division Public Works & Mobility Department - Surface Transportation

DISCUSSIONBACKGROUND: On September 24, 2012March 2, 2020, the City Council passed Resolution 7736Resolution 8416 establishing a funding assistance program for curbthe Funding Assistance Program to provide financial support for installation of sidewalks, approaches, boulevards, and sidewalk assessments for public right-of-way construction projects pursuant to Missoula Municipal Coderelated appurtenances in accordance with the provisions of MMC 12.10 (formerly MMC 12—Curbs, Sidewalks and Paving. The program funding assistance is described as the "City First Equal Share Model". Under this program, eligible_12). Eligible property owners are provided funding assistance in the following manner:per Resolution 8416.

<u>Deductible:</u> is the initial portion of the construction cost the City pays, from \$0.00 up to \$1,000, for public right-of-way improvements ordered by City Council.

<u>Co-pay:</u> is the percentage of construction cost the property owner pays, established at 50% of the construction costs, above the \$1,000 <u>Deductible</u> to be assessed as a special tax against the property in front of or along which the public right-of-way construction improvements are installed.

Normal Maximum Out of Pocket: is the amount the property owner pays up to the next \$3,500 for assessments and any amount over \$15,000 Stop Loss Amount described below to be assessed as a special tax against the property in front of or along which the public right-of-way construction improvements are installed.

Stop Loss Amount: is the amount that the City pays in excess of the Normal Maximum Out of Pocket of \$3,500 up to \$15,000 assessment amount. All assessed costs above the \$15,000 Stop Loss Amount are to be assessed to the property owner as a special tax against the property in front of or along which the public right-of-way construction improvements are installed.

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POLICY: The <u>funding assistance program Funding Assistance Program</u> shall be used to assist property owners with <u>publicadjacent right-of-way construction-improvements under the following conditions:</u>

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- Road District #1 funds-The funding assistance shall only be allocated toward constructionsidewalk and related improvements, and does not include street section work, adjacent to properties ordered in by City Council through the Annual Sidewalk Installation Replacement Program. This does not include properties in the annual Miscellaneous Parcels Project ordered by City Council-Special Improvement Assessment Program (Program).
- Funding assistance shall only be available to those properties with Road District #1 yearly
 assessments greater than \$0. Properties that do not contribute to thepay property taxes (i.e.
 publicly owned property, non-profits, etc.) or otherwise contribute to Road District #1 are
 ineligible.
- 3. Funding assistance for vacant parcels that have a Road District #1 yearly assessment greater than \$0 will be applied based on the 1 & 2 Family Dwelling formula.
- 3.4. Funding assistance for eligible properties shall be based on the actual construction costs, not including finance costs, for those pertions of worksidewalks, approaches, boulevards and related improvements as determined to be necessary by the City Engineer for Surface Transportation and quantified in the City Council order and/or on the construction plans. All other workimprovements desired by the property owner, if permitted to be constructed, will not receive funding assistance but may be financed through the assessment programutilize City financing.
- 4-5. For eligible properties to receive funding assistance the property owner must participate in the City Council ordered project and the City's hired contractor must complete the work. If the property owner elects to obtain their own contractor, funding assistance is not available. This funding assistance does not includeHowever, these property owners hiring their own contractor to construct curb and sidewalk related improvements and subsequentlycould still be included in the Miscellaneous Parcels Order for the sole purpose of using City financing through the assessment programfor infrastructure improvements.
- 5.6. Properties identified for inclusion in a City Council ordered project for which a building and/or zoning permit has been issued requiring curb and/or sidewalk repair, replacement-of, and/or installation prior to City Council ordering the project are ineligible for thefunding assistance. Once these prior requirements have been satisfied, these properties will be eligible for future funding assistance.
 - Utility service stubs/repairs, landscaping (other than topsoil/seeding & sleeves), boulevard irrigation,
- 6-7. Removal of encroachments, such as fences, structures, signs-and, or other private improvements requiring removal/relocationnot provided for in Section 8 below, and installation and/or repair of utility service lines within the public right-of-way, are not eligible expenses ineligible for funding assistance and will be fully assessed to the property owner.
- 7-8. Tree/stump/shrub removal, Removal and replacement of trees, landscaping, irrigation, and related improvements such as irrigation ditch work, retaining walls, etc. boulevard topsoil, seeding and sleeves, that isare required and necessary for the installation of curb and/or, sidewalk, and related improvements are eligible expenses for funding assistance.

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
