 Recommended motion: City Council recommends to amend or adopt a resolution revising the Parks and Recreation Master Fee Schedule for facility use, reservations, permits and program for 2022.

Deadline: Final consideration January 24, 2022

Background and Alternatives Explored:

Document is the foundation for fees associated with facility reservations, facility fees, all Use Permits (Concessions, Special Use, Park Use, Conservation, Alcohol, Amplification, Marshall Mountain, etc.) and program fees.

The process for annual review of these proposed fees includes meetings with user groups, discussion and approval by the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, review with the Missoula County Park, Trails and Open Space Advisory Board, discussion and review by the Parks and Conservation Committee, City Council, and a Public Hearing.
