3.1 Purchase of One (1) Backhoe for Street Department

Scot Colwell Fleet Director presenting,

The purchase of this backhoe is approved on the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) and the vehicle replacement program. It will replace an older backhoe on the street department fleet. The purchase includes two buckets and a hydraulic thumb. The older backhoe will go to the Parks Department to replace an even older one in that fleet. 3.2 Bid Award with Prospect Construction Inc., for the Lincoln Hills Water Tank Improvements

Andy Schultz City Engineer for Utilities presenting,

This project is a bid award for the Lincoln Hills water storage tanks, to Prospect Construction. There are currently two tanks in Lincoln Hills, and they are undsized aging metal that need to be replaced. These tanks are fully buried and have been identified as a priority in the water facilities plan because buried tanks provide a multitude of problems for a water system. This project was bid as cast-in-place concrete tanks back in May of 2021. At that time, the City received two high bids due to materials. The City reached out to a different tank manufacturer that makes a pre-stressed concrete tank. The prestressed concrete tank has some advantages over the cast-in-place tank. The City put this project out to bid again as a pre-stressed tank, and the bids came in even higher. The lowest bid for the cast-in-place bidder was willing to honor the original bid. The total of the bid comes in at \$2,154,490.18 and will be paid out of the water enterprise fund via a state revolving loan.

Ms. Harp as if it was normal for a contractor to be willing to honor an original bid like this. Mr. Schultz replied that we should be very thankful for this contractor. He says they are new to town and interested in getting more City projects.

Ms. Merritt asked how long the current tanks have been in place. Mr. Schutz replied since the '50s, and they were not really designated as water tanks. He added the new tanks should last 50 to 100 years with regular maintenance.

The public utility easement and roadway easement are located at 5710 Lariat Loop. The owner of this property is requesting that the City vacate the thirty-foot wide public roadway easement and the sixty-foot wide public utility easement. The purpose of the easements was for the future extension of Roundup Drive. However, Roundup Drive will not be extended because of the recent construction of Chuckwagon Drive. The property owner would like to build a garage in this space. The utility contacts have all been notified and signed a release of the easement. The property owner currently owns the property and would like to make full use of his property. Since Roundup Drive is not a viable option for a through street, the City is willing to help the property owner and vacate the easements.
