### Purpose



- Our goal is to strengthen neighborhood participation and build opportunities for neighborhood communication, neighborhoodinitiated projects and problem solving.
- Each year, the City Council allocates \$21,000 for NH Project Funds
- Grant recipients are awarded up to \$6,000
- Project must be within city limits and/or benefits city residents and has lasting benefits
- Project must be completed within a reasonable amount of time

### Ineligible Project Types



- Direct social services
- Ongoing general organizational support or overhead
- Direct grants, scholarships, or loans for the benefit of a specific individual
- Loans or debt
- Annual appeals or fundraisers
- Emergency funding
- Event insurance or alcohol permits
- Business promotion

Attend Grant Workshop Coordinate and consult with identified agencies and land managers

Coordinate neighborhood support Compile application including attachments and letters of support

### 3<sup>rd</sup> Street Third Space



Neighborhood: Riverfront


Amount Requested: \$6,000

• Recommended Award: \$5,500

#### Project:

 Improve safety and visual appearance of the traffic calming installation at the intersection of 3<sup>rd</sup> and Myrtle to create a "third space"

- Highest scoring project
- Connects to Neighborhood Greenway Project Priorities
- Award adjusted to \$5,500



### NS/WS Public Art & Placemaking



- Neighborhood: Northside/Westside
- Amount Requested: \$5,303.77
- Recommended Award: \$3,800
- Project:
  - One large street mural and three quick build traffic circle enhancement installations
- Project Comments:
  - High community benefit and engagement
  - Connects to Neighborhood Greenway Project Priorities
  - Award adjusted to \$3,800
    - Does not fund the other two circles and refreshments



### Ninkpata Park Preliminary Plan



- Neighborhood: Farviews/Pattee Canyon
- Amount Requested: \$6,000
- Recommended Award: \$5,300
- Project:
  - Topographic survey and preliminary design for Ninkpata Park
- Project Comments:
  - High community need and engagement
  - Connects to P&R Priorities
  - Award adjusted to \$5,300
    - P&R indicated that they will be able to assist with addressing this funding adjustment



# Call for Street Art (Traffic Circles)



Neighborhood: Lewis & Clark

Amount Requested: \$6,000

Recommended Award: \$5,300

#### • Project:

 Three quick-build circles – artist to complete fully painted traffic circle plus two designs for citizen-engagement art projects during the 2022 Sunday Streets

- Great fit for NH, High community need and great community engagement with connection to Sunday Streets
- Connects to Neighborhood Greenway Project Priorities
- Award adjusted to \$5,300

### **Bonner Park Upgrades**



Neighborhood: University

Amount Requested: \$6,000

Recommended Award: \$1,100

Project:

 Upgrades – pickleball courts and a preliminary study for the addition of outdoor exercise equipment


- Pickleball painting very supported
- Preliminary study does not connect with current P&R workplan
- Award adjusted to \$1,100 to fully fund the pickleball painting, but not the preliminary design elements



### **Barrow Pit Trail Engineering Report**



- Neighborhood: Upper Rattlesnake
- Amount Requested: \$2,000
- No Recommended Award
- Project:
  - Engineering addendum for laying a gravel surface on the proposed Barrow Pit Trail
- Project Comments:
  - Community need and benefit is clear, however the project is not a high priority for transportation/engineering
  - Project was funded in 2010 (\$3,000 NH Grant Funds) with no movement forward – concern that these funds would not be effective
  - No funding at this time




### Invermere Park Improvements



- Neighborhood: Miller Creek
- Amount Requested: \$4,500
- No Recommended Award
- Project:
  - Maintenance assistance for Invermere subdivision through the HOA

- No communication or support from Miller Creek Leadership Team
- Grant funds should be used for improvement projects, not maintenance focused projects
- Would welcome future park improvement grants applications once park is fully mature
- No funding at this time



### Recommended Funding

 The grant committee is recommended funding for five (5) of the seven (7) grant applications that were submitted with partial funding for all five.

#### Recommended Motion:

 I move the City Council adopt a resolution of the City Council awarding \$21000 in Neighborhood Project Fund Grants for fiscal year 2022 to certain organizations and directing staff to negotiate contracts with said organizations for the Mayor's signature.
