#### What and Why

- 10-Year Plan launched in 2012, reaches 10 year life in 2022
- Evaluation intended to understand successes, challenges, gaps, and where shifts are required given changes in last 10 years
- Funding
  - \$42,000 from fund balance, approved in FY22 budget cycle
  - Additional funds through generous partnership with United Way of Missoula County to provide compensation for people with lived expertise of houselessness
- Limited Solicitation process
  - Reached out to 11 firms, received 3 proposals, selected JGRE

Identify and assess gaps and areas for continued progress

### Develop

Develop strategic report that will inform the next phase of Reaching Home: Missoula's 10year Plan to End Homelessness

#### **Project Priorities**

Complete a retrospective evaluation – focused on understanding the drivers of successes and barriers to achieving elements in the 2012 Reaching Home plan to end homelessness

- Leverage information gathered in previously completed reports
- Use participatory-based research
   approaches to encourage inclusion of lived
   experts in the research design and analysis
- Identify areas of overlap and contradiction in perspectives from those who engage in the housing care system in Missoula county



#### Approach – Qualitative Data

#### *Interviews*

Lived experts - individuals who have utilized housing services and experienced housing barriers or houselessness in Missoula

City and Housing Agency Staff

Direct Service providers - Trinity, Temporary safe outdoor space, Poverello center...

Indirect service providers – Behavioral health, EMS, Law enforcement...

Community stakeholders – Landlords, Chamber of Commerce...
