Authorize the Mayor to sign a contract with A&E Design to complete Police Facilities Planning including needs assessment, site assessment, and conceptual design.

Background and Alternatives Explored:

Missoula Police Department facilities are outdated and overprescribed. In 2022 Council approved \$101,500 to evaluate current and projected space needs of the Police Department and to evaluate ways to meet those needs. Staff has selected a local firm (A&E Design) working in partnership with a law enforcement facilities specialist (Architects Design Group ([Law Enforcement Facilities - Architects Design Group](http://LawEnforcementFacilities-ArchitectsDesignGroup.adgusa.org) (adgusa.org))) to identify department space needs, evaluate sites to potentially meet those needs, and to develop conceptual designs that would meet department needs. The project will evaluate both City Hall and alternative potential department locations against preliminary cost estimates, operational impacts, access, and other criteria.

Financial Implications:

The contract is not to exceed \$95,000; funding was approved in FY 22.
