I've been suprised how ofter I've used the knowledge gained from talking and working with these organizations to direct the people to the right places.

As someone who has lived in Missoula for all his life, I can see some of the issues of a growing economy and a service industry that doesn't match the gorwing demand for wayfinding and general information for those coming to Missoula. People want to move here and those who have called Missoula their home are dealing with raising cost of living and a city looking at many avenues to create hosuing stock over the years. How can we facilitate a growing city, that people want to move to, especially the aging population which is on track to increase by 20 percent with the decade.

3.7 What is your understanding of the Mayor's general role in leading Missoula? basically to be a punching bag for the people of Missoula to vent their frustrations. For that I don't wish this kind of scrutiny on anyone, but I believe if I come out as someone who will facilitate the transition into Missoula's future. It's important for me to make sure everyone is well informed and have a clear message that the city is a well oiled machine and has Missoulian's best interests at heart.

3.8 What is your understanding of the Mayor's legal responsibilities and obligations in leading Missoula? Everything the Mayor does is a reflection on the city of Missoula as a whole. What they do in their work life and personal life often go hand and hand. The Mayor must be steadfast in their decision and own up to their mistakes. Being there is the most important thing and although the mayors office cannot be there to knock on every door to remind people about an upcoming zoning change, they must be clear in their work and their actions to reflect transparency.

3.9 What is your understanding of the Mayor's cultural and social leadership role in leading Missoula? Trends come and go, people change. Society will often be at odds from something new challenging something old. As long as we respect the dignity of individuals and groups of people we'll have nothing to worry about moving forward. The Previous Mayor, John Engen, wanted to create a land acknowlegment, that was unique to the city in their efforts to give repect to the Salish-Kootanai tribes that lived here before us and I wanted to see about having something that isn't just a read it and move on to the next item.

3.10 Describe your leadership philosophy and style to lead during a crisis. "Success is just a Byproduct of Hard Work." I heard that many years ago and have held onto that quote. Over the Pandemic I met many people with very polarizing views and it was clear that people were frustrated and scared. The longer things went on the more divided we became and having a place like city hall that has security and checks to even get into city council chambers makes me feel sad that we've lost touch with Missoulians. The struggle is real and the digital divide makes it even harder for our growing aging population to keep up.

From the very start, Missoula has had to deal with lack of resources and the pandemic led to many new programs that helped with hosuing security and creating mobile mental health crisis unit that we have seen success in mitigating lower level crisis and freeing up Police for other calls. I want to look into ways to have hard money devoted to programs that work and keep grants as a way to fund pilot programs, like Mobile Crisis Units, to expand and thrive. Its very fluid at times and we have to be aware that this money to going to the right places and not contributing to poor spending.



4. Equity, destigmatizing homeless and getting folks on track to finding a stable job and not jobs that keeps them too busy to handle day to day life.
5. Development, Missoula is trending into a bustling downtown and Missoula's in a unique ability to curb development through Tax Increament Financing.

For the time Being I want to lean on staff to keep things running smoothly and add some things that maybe benneficial to better communication with eachother and the people of Missoula.
