**Background and Alternatives Explored:**

The City of Missoula continues to partner closely with the Poverello Center to ensure that needs of neighbors who are unhoused in Missoula are met. This happens through various programs run by the Poverello Center, including Veteran's programs (Valor House and Housing Montana Heroes), food services, and shelter operations. This also happens through the Homeless Outreach Team, housed at the Poverello Center and designed to serve neighbors in Missoula who are unhoused and unsheltered. This funding will support the Poverello Center's ability to reliably provide these resources and increase partnerships with City entities and others throughout Missoula to collaborate on these efforts.

**Financial Implications:**

The City approved funding for this item in the FY23 budget cycle in the amount of \$211,476. These funds will come from the CPDI baseline budget funded by the general fund.
