ii The U.S. Army War College is the Army's top executive leadership school; it grants a Master of Strategic Studies degree to senior military and civilian leaders who complete the requirements of its course: strategic leadership, history, international relations, national security policy and strategy, operations management, problems solving, resource management, and responsible command. It is one of four war colleges in the country—the Navy and Air Force have one apiece, and the Pentagon directly operates the National War College as part of the National Defense University system. War colleges are the top finishing schools for military minds, and the Army handpicks the approximately 340 students who attend each year. The student body is multi-service and includes civilians from DoD and other departments and agencies such as State Department, and National Security Agencies, along with about 40 senior officers from foreign countries such as Saudi Arabia, Estonia, Israel, and New Zealand. Since it was founded in 1901, the Army War College has had some notable graduates, such as President Dwight D. Eisenhower and Secretary of State Collin Powell.
