- 2. What training and experience qualify you to analyze and interpret architectural and landscape drawings, site plans, and signage?

- 4. Knowing that excellent urban design may add cost to a development, how would you balance those interests?
- 5. The Design Review Board is a quasi-judicial board that requires objectivity and impartiality. Do you feel you can be non-biased during the design review process?
- 6. Please describe your previous service on a review board, panel, or commission as it relates to urban design or sign-related issues.

The training covers good governance, open meetings, public participation and right to know, ethics, conflicts of interest, bylaws, minutes, and parliamentary procedure, among other topics.
