3.3 Scott Street Property Update with Ravara

Update on the Scott Street Property with the consultants involved in the project. Please see drawings/presentation shared during the meeting.

Stacie Anderson - I really like this layout. Will these be permanently affordable?

Todd Schaper & Dawn McGee - Yes. These will not be allowed to be Air BNBs. There are caps to help keep things affordable for the future. Also working on having some of these units be Habitat for Humanity projects. There will be 42 townhomes and 36 condos.

Julie Merritt - Thank you for the update.

Heidi West - How will the long term maintenance be for those on the Community Land Trust?

Dawn McGee - We are working on those details.

Heather Harp - This is very forward thinking. We have moved away from full families with property and more toward smaller/single residents where there is minimal maintenance.

Amber Sherrill - I think this looks great. I am excited about this. I think it will be a real benefit for the neighborhood with the retail locations.

Jordan Hess - Can you discuss your community engagement?

Dawn McGee - The Northside/Westside crew have been very helpful in this process. We wanted to really listen to the neighborhood. There was an in-person meeting at Burns Street Bistro and it was a listening session for us with the neighborhoods. I know there are lots of small details but we are trying to incorporate the suggestions and meet the requirements. We went back to the community with our plans and we heard back that they were pretty happy and really wanted to see the Central Square stayed in place and that parking concerns were addressed.

Heidi West - In looking at the child care center, I am wondering how pick up and drop off will work. Wondering about the proposed traffic flow will be for those peak times?

Dawn McGee - I share your concerns and it is possible this may be moved once the final plan is in place. Thank you for the reminder.

Jordan Hess - I think having childcare near Mountain Line would be very important. How does this play in with the master plan for Public Works?

Jeremey Keene - We are working on the many pieces involved in this property and how to get it to all fit and get Mountain Line in there. We are continuing to work on it. I am meeting with Mountain Line very frequently to discuss space needs. No definite answers, but are working on it.

Mirtha Becerra - What is the zoning for the proposal?

Kiah Hochstetler - Discussed zoning.

Jordan Hess - Thank you for all the work on this project. We will need to continue to be innovative and creative and this is both.

Matts Larson - How is parkland being considered and issues involving parking and funding?

Dale Bickell - This design does include a park area in the Central Square.

Jordan Hess - We also have a long term lease on the Northside park. We are working on the park situation throughout Missoula.

Jordan Hess - This has created some equity issues, correct?

Dale Bickell - Yes.

Angela Simonson - My argument is that staff considerations should be skill-based rather than residency-based.

Amber Sherrill - I didn't even know this was a requirement. This doesn't make any sense to me. We live in a very difficult job market. I was wondering why a number of minutes was used, rather than distance outside the city boundaries?

Angela Simonson - In discussion with the Sr. Management, we aligned it with the First Responder ordinance.

Heidi West - Made the motion. While this ordinance was probably well-intentioned, it has brought up a number of issues that were probably not considered. I support the change.

Julie Merritt - I also support this. I feel this does border on discrimination and do not feel that acceptable. I understand the previous thinking, it sounds good, but in practice, does not work.

Public Comment -

Matts Larson - I would recommend voting no or revaluate this.

Mirtha Becerra - I fully support this. Given our current housing affordability issue, it is important to give people as many options as we can. I feel it is important that anyone who works for the city to make sure they have a pulse on the city and what is going on. I think there are different ways to get to the same goal.

Dale Bickell - Shared his screen with the Stop Loss Proposal document. Anytime we have an individual with a claim over \$160,000, this insurance starts up. This is in the budget and just to approve the contract.
