

Conservation District Interview Questions

1. Why do you want to be on the Board of Supervisors of the Conservation District and what particular qualities do you think you will bring to the board?
2. Are you familiar with the board's activities and what they are empowered to do under State law?
3. If selected, you would fill one of the City appointed positions. How do you view your role and responsibility?
4. Do you think the City of Missoula has any flooding problems, and what are your thoughts about controlling the flooding you have identified, if any?
5. Do you think water pollution from water erosion is a problem in Missoula? If so, what would you suggest as a means of lessening the problem under the authority of the Conservation District Board?
6. What are your thoughts on the preservation of farm land in the Missoula area?
7. Would it be appropriate in your opinion, to use funds derived from the Board's allowable levy to purchase development rights on the prime agricultural lands?
8. How do you view the board's role as a regulator of development and projects which may affect soils, water purity and runoff, flooding, and agricultural lands? Is it appropriate for the board to use its funds and authority to regulate development which may negatively impact these revenues?
9. How would you keep the City Council informed and involved in the Conservation District Board's activities which affect City goals and policies?
10. If you had a conflict of interest financially or otherwise, how would you deal with it?
11. The Board presently meets the second Monday of every month at 7 pm. Do you have time and are you willing to attend meetings and do research with respect to soil conservation matters?
