PROCLAMATION

- **WHEREAS**, in 1988, the World Health Organization recognized the first <u>World AIDS Day</u> on December 1st, to raise awareness of the AIDS pandemic caused by the spread of HIV infection, and to mourn the loss of those who have died from the disease; and
- **WHEREAS**, in 1989, in response to the worsening AIDS crisis and coinciding with the World Health Organization's second annual World AIDS Day, Visual AIDS organized the first **Day Without Art**; and
- WHEREAS, annually this day serves as a call for mourning and action in response to the ongoing HIV and AIDS crisis globally; celebrates the lives and achievements of lost colleagues and friends; encourages caring for all people with AIDS; educates diverse publics about HIV infection; and advances the work of finding a cure; and
- **WHEREAS**, June 2021 marked the 40th anniversary of the first cases reported in the U.S. of what would later become known as AIDS, a disease that has killed tens of millions of people to date; and
- WHEREAS, there are currently more than 1.2 million people in the U.S. and more than 38 million worldwide living with HIV; and
- **WHEREAS** the City of Missoula Public Art Committee will once again join Visual Aids in a Day With(out) Art by shrouding some public works of art throughout town in black sheets with red ribbons to bring attention and action to the ongoing global health crisis.
