Background and Alternatives Explored:

Animal Control is bringing proposed municipal code changes to the city council regarding multiple dog permits. These changes have been reviewed by the city attorney's office and have been discussed with the Animal Control Board. The Board recommended this proposal for the city council to consider.

Basically, the new language would:

- 1. Require applicants to pay an application fee up front, instead of waiting until after approval to collect fees.
- 2. Give the Animal Control Board the ability to approve applications for people who have had complaints lodged against them in the last two years, but have taken steps to correct the problems. Right now, the Board has no ability to approve a multiple dog permit if there has been an at large or barking complaint within the last two years, even if they owner has corrected the issues that led to the complaints.

3.	Clarify that someone can appeal to the Animal Control Board if Animal Control revokes a
multiple	e dog permit.
