Approve the construction contract with MJD Contracting for the replacement of the primary effluent lift pump at the Wastewater Reclamation Facility.

## **Background and Alternatives Explored:**

The City of Missoula Wastewater Utility issued a bid to replace the primary effluent lift pump (PEL Pump) at the City Wastewater Reclamation Facility (WWRF). The existing PEL pump is at the end of its useful life and needs to be replaced. The WWRF PEL Pump Replacement Project will install a new PEL pump and improve electrical controls. Major project aspects include:

- Removal of existing pump, pump base, and associated electrical equipment.
- Installation of new base and pump
- Installation of new electrical controls including a variable frequency drive

Electronic bids were opened on May 12, 2023. One bid was received from MJD Contracting with a total bid price of \$98,500.00. The bid was reviewed for completeness and accuracy and deemed responsive. The City's engineer on the project, Morrison-Maierle, has recommended that the City award the project to MJD Contracting.

**Financial Implications: \$98,500.00** This project will be funded by an SRF loan via the Wastewater Enterprise Fund.
