# **Background and Alternatives Explored:**

Missoula Water issued a bid to replace primarily 6" Kalamein water main from 1914 On Jackson St. and Monroe St. in the lower Rattlesnake. This project will replace approximately 1,500 feet of water main. Work will be in Jackson St from Vine St. to the alley north of Poplar St, Monroe St from Vine St. to the alley north of Cherry St. and Poplar St. between Monroe and Jackson. Due to the age and material type, this water main is considered a Priority 1 water main to be replaced.

Electronic bids were opened on Wednesday January 31st, 2024. Five bids were received. The bids were reviewed for completeness and accuracy and deemed responsive. Three out of five of the bids applied for the Apprenticeship Bidders Preference Program including the low bidder. The City's consultant engineer for the project, Woith Engineering Inc. has recommended that the City award the project to Prospect Construction Inc. as the low bidder with a bid cost of \$872,857.00. This is to be paid for by the Water Enterprise fund via an SRF loan.
