Background and Alternatives Explored:

This winter the City of Missoula has entered into a contract with Prospect Construction, Inc for the Momont No. 2 Wastewater System Improvements and the Harlequin Court Water Main Improvements. The Momont No. 2 Wastewater System Improvement will install gravity sewer main from the existing lift station to an existing gravity sewer main near the future intersection of George Elmer and West Broadway which will allow for the decommissioning of the existing Momont No. 2 Lift Station. The Harlequin Court Water Main Improvements will install a section of new transmission water main from Harlequin Court to the future intersection of George Elmer and West Broadway. Morrison-Maierle designed and bid the project. Morrison-Maierle's contract with the City did not include Construction Oversight services. Now that the construction contract has been awarded this amendment would cover Morrison-Maierle's construction administration, grant administration, and project closeout. This project is funded from two different sources. The Momont No. 2 Lift Station is funded by the Wastewater Enterprise fund via an ARPA

Minimum Allocation Grant with a match coming from a State Revolving Loan fund. The Harlequin Court Water Main Improvements will be funded by the Water Enterprise fund via an ARPA Minimum Allocation Grant with a match coming from a State Revolving Loan fund.

Financial Implications:
