




Project Overview Restoring Forest Health on City Conservation Lands

- Project Scope: Treat 237 acres on east slope of Mt. Jumbo and in Marshall Canyon
 - Directly adjacent to USFS and FWP property recently treated
 - Five adjacent private property owners
 - Marshall Creek sensitive waterway (W slope cutthroat)
 - Much of area previously treated 2011-2013
- ► Goals:
 - Reduce understory regeneration, restore healthy forest stand structure (prior Plum Creek Timber land)
 - ► Tie in with adjacent USFS & FWP treatments
 - Utilize prescribed fire through existing USFS/FWP coop agreement to extend retreatment intervals from ~10 to ~30 years



City of Missoula Mount Jumbo - Marshall Grade Forest Treatment Areas MT Forest Action Plan Grant Proposal




Project Overview

Restoring Forest Health on City Conservation Lands

- Partnered with Missoula County OEM (treating private property nearby)
- Requested \$290,000, awarded \$150,000
- Required 4:1 match (~\$37,500 City funds, primarily staffing)
- Reduced project area to 114 acres funded + 20 acres match = 134 total acres treated
 - ▶ 73 acres in-house (seasonal staff extensions)
 - ▶ 61 acres contracted
- Estimated costs
 - > 73 acres in-house \$1,000/acre
 - ▶ 61 acres contracted \$1500-2000/acre



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Project timeline

June 2024 Accept grant agreement

Fall 2024 Bid/award contracted units

Nov 2024 Begin treating in-house units

Spring 2025 Begin treating contracted units

► Fall 2025 Complete thinning work

Spring 2026 Complete pile burning, grant term.



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
