CROSBY AND CLEVELAND TRAFFIC CIRCLE FUNDING AGREEMENT

This agreement, dated July 1, 2019, establishes the terms and conditions of funding a traffic calming circle at the intersection of Crosby St and Cleveland St in Missoula, MT.

Intending to calm traffic and reduce the likelihood, frequency, and severity of motor vehicle crashes, immediate neighbors and the Rose Park Neighborhood Leadership Team submitted a Traffic Calming application to City staff. A traffic calming circle was proposed and agreed to by both the neighborhood and City Engineering.

Installation of the traffic calming circle includes right-of-way permitting, demolition of asphalt, installation of concrete circle and 2' wide asphalt patch back, installation of traffic signs, installation of 12" of topsoil, and curb and gutter work at the NE corner to ensure adequate turning radius and ADA compliance.

The total cost estimate to install the traffic calming circle is \$17,500.00

Funding for this project will be comprised of three sources:

Neighborhood grant program - \$2,500.00

Private contribution - \$5050.00

City Engineering General Fund - \$9,950.00 or the remaining balance following final invoicing from the contractor.

Upon completion of construction of the traffic calming circle, the neighbors in the immediate vicinity will be responsible for planting and maintaining the landscaping within the circle.





The residents of the 200 - 300 block of W. Crosby St. and the 500 - 700 block of Cleveland St., as defined by the photo below, would like a traffic calming device, such as a traffic circle, to:



- slow motor vehicle speeds;
- deter through-traffic from using these streets;
- provide an aesthetic enhancement to the streetscape; and
- lessen the possibility, frequency and severity of crashes at our intersection.

As evidenced by the attached aerial map, three (3) schools are nearby and are impacted:

- Many students at Willard Alternative High School walk, drive, are driven daily;
- St. Joseph's School on Stephens would be affected in the same manner;
- The children at "Spirit of Play Day Care Center on Stephens must be driven, and often are biked, bike, walk or are walked to school each day. All year, these students walk, and even bike, to Willard Park to play during their school day, necessitating crossing two streets at our intersection, and:
- in the month of June, walk daily from their school to Willard Park for soccer lessons:
- in July, walk daily past our intersection to go to swim lessons at Currents Aquatic Center; and
 - In August, walk or bike daily to Willard Park for a multi-sports class.

Students who attend Washington Middle School walk past our intersection to W. Crosby St. to be picked up at the base of Longstaff St., outside of Willard Park, by the school bus. They then walk home past our intersection.

Folks from many blocks away walk to Willard Park with their children and dogs to play daily, pushing strollers and holding leashes as they cross. There has probably been even more use of Willard since the closing of St. Joseph's Playground after school hours.

Our streets are used by motorists as a shortcut to reach Stephens from 6th Street, and to reach Beckwith from Cleveland St. and beyond.

This is especially evidenced during the 45 minute daily lunch period at Willard Alternative School, when the students are very enthusiastic to get to, and even more so, to return to, their school.

We also have several young children living in the 700 block of Stephens Avenue. We appreciate and thank you for your consideration of our application.

This intersection has what we believe to be a disproportionate number of traffic accidents. Three out of four fences at that intersection have been hit and had to be repaired or replaced—sometimes more than once. We have lived here for twelve years and have seen the aftermath of a number accidents, some with emergency services responding. Cars travelling in all directions seem to feel that they are on the boulevard or arterial. We have witnessed numerous near misses. Often both drivers look straight ahead and continue at high rates of speed, somehow assuming that there won't be any cross traffic, or that the cross traffic will yield.

With traffic from Willard Alternative High School and the young, inexperienced drivers, plus people using Cleveland and Crosby to get to Beckwith and Stephens, or to avoid Stephens due to the limited turns available, there is a lot happening at this intersection. It is a route for school buses, and there are many students of all ages—including our own kids—walking to and from the bus stop at Willard, and there is a nearby preschool that walks to the playing fields at Willard. There are also a lot of bicyclists.

We would love to see a traffic circle at this intersection and are happy to do whatever is needed to help make that happen. Thank you!

1. Neighborhood Small Grant Funds

\$2,000.00

City Council allocates \$2,000 of the \$20,000 Neighborhood Project Funds to be used for small project grants, pursuant to City Council Resolution 7581. The Community Forum will review and approve small project grant applications at the monthly meetings. The City Clerk is responsible to ensure that small project grants are spent in accordance with City policies and procedures.

2. Miller Creek Road/Brooks Street Traffic Signal Box Art

\$1500 Recommended funding

(Neighborhood Improvement)

Request for \$1,500. This grant will allow the Traffic Signal Box subcommittee of the Missoula Public Art Committee to select and pay an artist to beautify the traffic signal box at the corner of Miller Creek Road/Brooks Street.

NPF Committee Recommendations: \$1,500. Project Coordinator will work with the Public Art Committee. MDT approval must be obtained if needed and will need to coordinate with the Parks Department (Chris Boza) if the box is in an irrigated area.

3. Ben Hughes HOA Irrigation and Vegetation Enhancement

\$900 recommended funding

(Neighborhood Improvement)

Request for \$900. Provide irrigation and a sprinkling system to a portion of the entrance to the Ben Hughes. The area is part of the Adopted Park that the HOA and City have developed. Recent enhancements to the area include steps down to the Clark Fork River to complete a trail through Ben Hughes Park and provide access to the small beach below street level. The City Parks and Rec Department planted trees and shrubs at street level in this area to further beautify the area and minimize improper access to the river. Irrigation will augment these plantings.

NPF Committee Recommendations: \$900.

Project coordinator must work closely with the Parks Department before implementation. All work must meet/exceed adopted master plans and design standards.

4. Flourishing Mural Part 3

\$3,000 recommended funding

The mural is a collaboration with Willard Alternative High School students, staff, and community volunteers. Nutritional Laboratories International and artist Stephanie Frostad. This phase will be the final phase and complete the wall.

NPF Committee Recommendations: \$3,000

Project coordinator must obtain written agreement with Nutritional Labs for the maintenance and/or removal if vandalized. The trail must be kept clear and safe at all times. Coordinator must coordinate with Parks and Rec and a final sketch must be provided to the Parks Department for approval before beginning work.

5. W. Crosby/Cleveland Traffic Calming

\$2,500 recommended funding

(Neighborhood Improvement)

Request for \$3,000. This is a request for assistance in paying for traffic calming (traffic circle) at the intersection to slow traffic, provide an aesthetic enhancement to the streetscape and lessen possibility, frequency and severity of crashes at the intersection.

NPF Committee Recommendations: \$2,500

This project is contingent on City approval and agreement to have an S.I.D. approved by affected neighbors. Some curbing will need to be extended where there is none. Surrounding neighbors will be required to sign a maintenance agreement for the upkeep of the circle. Project Coordinator must work closely with Doug Harby, Engineering Construction Project Manager and Ben Weiss, Bike Ped Manager and Jane Kelly, Neighborhood Coordinator.

6. Jeannette Rankin Park Renovation

\$2,200 recommended funding

(Neighborhood Improvement, Neighborhood Outreach)

Request for \$2,200. This project seeks to provide two benches and two trash can stands to the restoration at the Jeannette Rankin Park, a valuable recreational resource, educational opportunity and gateway to the University District Neighborhood. The Neighborhood will also reach out to stakeholders and create partnerships through shared volunteer opportunities during the Park restoration.

NPF Committee Recommendations: \$2,200

Project Coordinator must work closely with the Parks and Rec Department. Projects must meet/exceed various adopted master plans and design standards including the master plan for Janet Rankin Park.

7. Franklin to the Fort Traffic Signal Box Art

\$3,000 recommended funding

(Neighborhood Improvement)

Request for \$3,000. This grant will allow the Traffic Signal Box subcommittee of the Missoula Public Art Committee to select and pay an artist to beautify the traffic signal boxes at the corners of North and Russell and South and Garfield.

NPF Committee Recommendations: \$3,000. Project Coordinator will work with the Public Art Committee. MDT approval must be obtained if needed and will need to coordinate with the Parks Department (Chris Boza) if the box is in an irrigated area.

8. North Hill Trails Kiosk

\$3,000 recommended funding

(Neighborhood Improvement)

Request for \$3,000. This grant is for the development of informational panels for a kiosk at the newly developed North Hills Trailhead. The Missoula Trails Crew will be responsible for the remaining cost of Kiosk structure and installation.

NPF Committee Recommendations: \$3,000. Project Coordinator must work closely with the Parks and Rec Department. Projects must meet/exceed various adopted master plans and design standards.

9. Pleasant View Park Seating, Tables and Trees

\$1,900 recommended funding

(Neighborhood Improvement)

Request for \$3,000. This project is requesting funds for the purchase of picnic tables/benches with A.D.A. concrete pad; bench with A.D.A. accessible concrete pad and a flat leaf tree with planting and sod repair.

*NPF Committee Recommendations: \$1,900. Coordinator must work closely with the Parks and Rec Department. Projects must meet/exceed various adopted master plans and design standards.

Funds are allotted as follows: \$500 for concrete pad for A.D.A. picnic table; \$800 bench and two \$300 trees as a primer to prove success and garner neighbor support for a future request.

The following project was not recommended for funding:

Median Restoration

\$0 recommended funding

(Neighborhood Improvement)

Request \$2,970. Removal of dead trees and replacements to prevent erosion on the median at Artemos and Crestview Lane.

NPF Committee Recommendations: Not funded.
